**FOUR CHARGED WITH ATTEMPTED MURDER**  
**OF VICTIM WHO WAS SHOT AND DUMPED AT LAGUARDIA AIRPORT**

*Defendants Face Up To 25 Years In Prison*

Queens District Attorney Richard A. Brown, along with Port Authority Police Superintendent Michael A. Fedorko, announced today that four individuals have been charged with shooting a Las Vegas man during the course of a drug deal gone bad and then dumping the victim within the confines of LaGuardia Airport late Monday night.

District Attorney Brown said, "This case is just one more glaring example of mindless gun-related violence that recklessly puts people's lives at risk. The Port Authority Police are to be commended for their professional and diligent investigation that led to the swift apprehension of those allegedly involved."

Superintendent Fedorko said, "Our Port Authority Police Officers took control of this investigation from the very beginning. Shrewd detective work and determination netted four suspects within 36 hours of the shooting. We do not tolerate any type of nefarious business or violence on our airports and for those who try, the message is clear: we will find you and we will arrest you. I want to personally thank all the men and women of the PAPD who worked tirelessly – and with amazing speed – to bring these four individuals to justice."

The District Attorney identified the defendants as Javier Rodriguez, 28, of 21 Odell Avenue in White Plains, New York; Raymundo Martinez-Flores, 29, of Brooklyn; Adolfo Gonzalez, 21, of 805 Albany Avenue in Brooklyn; and Dario Campbell, 25, of 1918 Linden Boulevard in Queens. The defendants are charged with second-degree attempted murder, first-degree assault, second-degree criminal possession of a weapon, first-degree robbery and first-degree criminal use of a firearm. They each face up to 25 years in prison if convicted. They are presently awaiting arraignment in Queens Criminal Court.

District Attorney Brown said that, according to the criminal complaint, the victim, Cedric Click, 26, was visiting from Las Vegas and staying at the LaGuardia Airport Marriott Hotel when he was lured from his room under the pretense that he was going to engage in a drug deal. He was allegedly picked up by the defendants at the hotel in a silver Nissan Pathfinder registered to defendant Rodriguez. Once inside the vehicle a gold chain was allegedly torn from the victim's neck by defendant Campbell, who allegedly also took the victim's wallet and cellphone. The victim then attempted to jump out of the vehicle and was allegedly shot in the back by defendant Martinez-Flores and dumped out of the car near a taxi holding lot inside the airport. He underwent surgery at Elmhurst Hospital and is listed in stable condition. PAPD detectives executed search warrants in the aftermath of the shooting and recovered three handguns. They also recovered a gold chain from a sewer in Brooklyn.

The investigation was conducted by detectives assigned to the Port Authority Police Department's Eastern Zone under the direct supervision of Detective Lieutenant William Hanley and the overall supervision of Inspector Anthony Fitzgerald.

Assistant District Attorney Catherine C. Kane, Chief of the District Attorney's Airport Investigations Unit, is prosecuting the case under the supervision of Gerard A. Brave, Bureau Chief of the District Attorney's Organized Crime and Rackets Bureau, and Mark L. Katz, Deputy Bureau Chief, and the overall supervision of Executive Assistant District Attorney for Investigations Peter A. Crusco and Deputy Executive Assistant District Attorney Linda M. Cantoni.

It should be noted that a criminal complaint is merely an accusation and that a defendant is presumed innocent until proven guilty.
