**TWO BROOKLYN RESIDENTS SENTENCED TO 25 YEARS IN PRISON  
FOR STABBING DEATH OF FLUSHING MAN OUTSIDE ASTORIA NIGHTCLUB**

*One Defendant Sentenced to Additional 7 Years For Stabbing Second Man In Leg*

Queens District Attorney Richard A. Brown announced today that two men from the Williamsburg section of Brooklyn have been sentenced to lengthy prison terms for the stabbing death of one man and the wounding of another following a dispute outside the Clic nightclub in Astoria in July 2005.

District Attorney Brown said, "A verbal assault by the defendants quickly escalated into a physical assault, during which the two victims were stabbed, one fatally. The deceased was a young man with a bright future ahead of him, and his untimely death is a constant reminder to his family of the defendants' senseless actions. Hopefully, they can find some degree of closure in knowing that those responsible have been punished and will be isolated from harming anyone else in society for a long time."

The District Attorney identified the defendants as Jonathan W. Andujar, 23, of 541 Wythe Avenue in Brooklyn, no known employment, and Angel Class, 22, unemployed, of 60 Division Avenue in Brooklyn. Both defendants were convicted of first-degree manslaughter last month before Queens Supreme Court Justice Michael Aloise who yesterday sentenced each defendant to a determinate term of 25 years in prison. Class, who was also convicted of second-degree assault, was sentenced to an additional seven years in prison.

District Attorney Brown said that, according to the trial testimony, on Saturday, July 9, 2005, at 4:50 a.m. in front of 35-20 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue in Astoria, Queens, the defendants acted in concert in stabbing Dimitrios "Jimmy" Zisimopoulos, 24, in the abdomen – fatally wounding him – and cutting Michael Geroulakis, 27, of Brooklyn, on the right leg. The incident occurred after the defendants had left the Clic nightclub, located at 32-04 Broadway.

Assistant District Attorney Peter V. Lomp, of the District Attorney's Homicide Trials Bureau, prosecuted the case under the supervision of Assistant District Attorneys Brad A. Leventhal, Bureau Chief, and Jack Warsawsky, Deputy Bureau Chief, and the overall supervision of Executive Assistant District Attorney for Major Crimes Charles A. Testagrossa and Deputy Executive Assistant District Attorney for Major Crimes Daniel A. Saunders.
